

IMPORTANT TAX UPDATE FROM

Slippery Rock Township, Butler County

Summary of changes and required responsibilities of ALL Employees for the withholding and remittance of Earned Income Tax in the state of Pennsylvania

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS

LOCATED IN SLIPPERY ROCK TOWNSHIP PENNSYLVANIA

COMMONWEALTH - ACT 32 OF 2008 - EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2012

Act 32 will revamp the system of collecting Earned Income Tax (EIT) across Pennsylvania. It will reduce the number of state-wide collectors from 560 to 69 tax collection districts (TCD) and restructure how EIT is collected.

All Employers (large and small) will be required to withhold EIT from all employees. Tax rate will be determined

by the employee's place of residency. However, one exception remains: if the place where you, the taxpayer, are employed has a higher EIT rate than the rate where you reside, then you are subject to a higher EIT rate. Areas with higher EIT rates are communities with a distressed pension plan under (Act 205) or, a distressed area under (Act 47).

As residents subject to Earned Income Tax in Slippery Rock Township, the following changes will apply:

- All Earned Income Tax (EIT) will be withheld by employers and, remitted to a single Tax Officer designated to represent the Tax Collection District (TCD).
- The taxes will then be distributed to the employee's proper place of residency, in your case, Slippery Rock Township and the Slippery Rock Area School District.
- **All EMPLOYEES must fill out a Residency Certification Form and return it to their employer to ensure their EIT is withheld and distributed properly. (Sample form enclosed)**
- Employee EIT rates will be decided by the employee's political subdivision. A complete tax register of all EIT rates by location can be found at the DCED website: www.newpa.com.
- **The political subdivision code (PSD) for Slippery Rock Township is 100609.**
- **If a change in residency occurs, employees must inform employers of their new residency.**

Berkheimer Tax Administrator was selected by the Butler County Tax Collection Committee (BCTCC) as the Tax Officer for Butler County. Berkheimer has been involved with much of Butler County tax collection in recent years making for a much easier transition to the new collection system. The role of the employee in this new collection system is to keep their employer aware of their residency at all times. The actual process of withholding, remitting, and collection of tax dollars is put into the hands of the employer and the collector. The Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) will be making available uniform forms for all employees, employers, and collectors.
